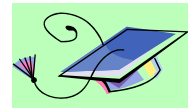


Table 2f. Schools, Colleges, and Universities

Students completing the Senior Exit Plans Survey were asked to write the name of the school they planned to attend during the year following their graduation from high school. Students were asked to bubble in the college or university College Board code of the school they planned to attend. Codes for over 100 schools were provided on the back of the survey form. If a student's intended school was not among those listed on the back of the survey form, students were instructed to write in the name of the school in the space provided. The following table lists the names of the schools (alphabetical order) by state including District of Columbia (with Hawaii listed first). Technical schools without a College Board code that could determine the state in which they were located are listed under "Technical, Trade, or Institute." Schools in US Territories/Jurisdictions or in other countries follow the Technical, Trade, or Institute category. Percents are based upon the total number of school bound students responding to this item.

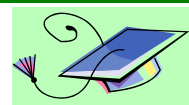

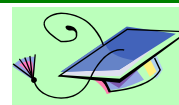
