"Noelani is a learning community that nurtures responsible world citizens."

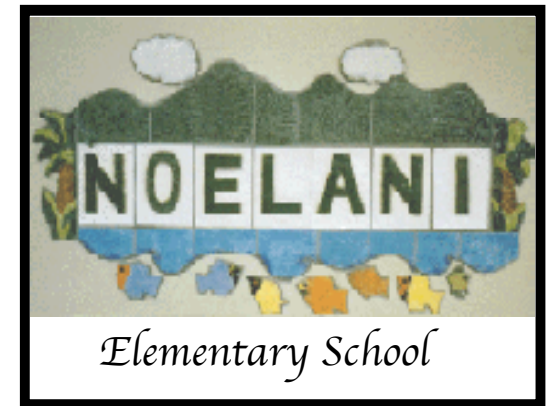
